WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- A pregnant woman
- A breastfeeding woman
- A woman who has recently been pregnant
- An infant or a child less than 5 years old

SERVICES PROVIDED:

- Nutritious foods
- Nutrition counseling
- Breast feeding support
- Health care referral

TO BE ELIGIBLE, YOU MUST ALSO:

- Have a low or moderate income
AND
- Have a special need that can be helped by WIC foods and nutrition counseling

APPROVED WIC FOODS:

- Milk, cheese, eggs, cereals, peanut butter, fruit or vegetable juices, dry beans or peas, iron fortified formula

YOU DO NOT HAVE TO BE ON PUBLIC ASSISTANCE TO APPLY.
